On 25th May 2018, the EU GDPR comes into effect; and it's here to stay well beyond Brexit. This significant legislation will succeed the Data Protection Act 1998 (DPA), and is described by some as the "biggest single shake up of data legislation in the last 25 years". The Information Commissioner, Elizabeth Denham said at a ICAEW conference earlier this year:

"There's a lot in the GDPR you'll recognise from the current law, but make no mistake, this one's a game changer for everyone."

The legislation will have wide reaching affects for all organisations who collect, manage, process and store personally identifiable and personal sensitive data for EU citizens - anywhere in the world.

The GDPR will be a Board level accountability, with requirements for clear governance and reporting to ensure compliance. The consequences for organisations that fail to demonstrate compliance and are found in breach of the regulation are substantial: offenders risk facing financial penalties of up to €20 million or 4% of an organisation's global turnover, whichever is the greater, criminal prosecution, in addition to damage to reputation.

With the 2018 compliance deadline rapidly approaching, it is essential that organisations start preparing for these changes now. This one day training course will develop essential GDPR awareness and understanding, and will cover the following:
